On the whole the 22/23 season was a success despite some challenges early on. Sheila was instrumental in developing netball at Billesley and Kings Heath Little League Netball and Bournville and was a huge inspiration to myself. Some of my own early netball memories involve Sheila. More recently our County President Margaret Palmer passed away on 27th September 2023. Margaret assisted several Roses teams whilst acting as team manager for England Netball and was a key member and club president at Lyndon Centre. Margaret has been a great support to myself since I joined the committee and she will be sorely missed by everyone who knew her.

Due to a few role changes mid year I would like to extend my thanks to Sam Evans (schools) Alanna Rolinson (officiating) and David Griffiths and Colette Thomson for their academy support in anticipation of the 23/24 season. We pass on our thanks to Chauvell Lynch and Anne-Marie Hooper who have left us this year as well as John Sproson who helped to support the umpires for the schools competitions. Carla Lloyd has taken over this role. Once again I would like to extend my thanks to every committee member for all their hard work in facilitating and supporting netball in Birmingham.

Birmingham had plenty of nominations at the One Awards with myself, Anne-Marie Hopper, Gaynor Jones and Kemi Okunnu all up for an award. Sadly, non of us won, but it was still a great night. Asia Liquat however did go on to win the National Inclusion Award at the National One Awards held at The Belfry in October.

The AGM was held via Zoom in November 2022 attended by Clubs Reps and Committee and the financial statement was approved with the closing balance of £13461.32


Five committee meetings were held during the year via Zoom. Meetings were positive and proactive and enabled us to share knowledge and experiences, stay connected with England Netballs' forward plan and each of the Birmingham Leagues.

During the year there were changes to the BNA Committee membership. Ann Marie Hooper left the position of Pathway Development Lead and was replaced by David Griffiths as coopted lead. The Schools' Lead was co-opted as Sam Evans however during the year school responsibilities were split between primary and secondary schools and Sophie Masterson and Salli Rudge were co-opted into these positions respectively. Sam Evans remained on the Committee as Event lead moving forward. Alanna Robinson became the Officiating Lead shadowing Hannah Reed (as this was a dual role alongside the Chair role).

We completed our County Plan of improvement actions to feed into the overall West Midlands 1–3-year plan.

Coaching bursaries were provided for 4 Level 2 Coaches and 2 new Level 1 Coaches to county members during the year.

Officiating Report- Alanna Robinson

This year we've made a good start and progress into building our umpiring network. We have been successful with offering Informal free observations for all umpires on the pathway which will continue to be funded by the County prior to final assessment (as Pre assessments have been removed) if they wish (15.00 for the assessor). In relation to Into awards, if an observation is successful, the candidate may be offered the choice to do the assessment straight away. In which case the learner pays for the assessment not the county. This makes best use of the assessors' time, if only viewing 2 learners.

Most people are now aware of the process for booking onto courses and uptake has been good in Birmingham. There is still more demand for assessments and mentoring that still cannot be met by the county.

BNL league commenced on 9th September 2023 and have agreed to continue to allow us to carry out C award assessment on league fixtures up to division 4.

There have been no forums as of yet this year but we plan to hold some in January once we have received the changes to the rules. The forums will also focus on issues we have encountered and witnessed at central venue fixtures which we have viewed as important to revisit.

<u>Pathway Development Programme - David Griffiths</u>

Birmingham County ran U15 and U13 PDP (known as Academies) between September 2022 and July 2023. Trials were held in early September, in line with England Netball guidance. The trials attracted nearly 200 applicants across the two age groups. Whilst this caused a few challenges for the selectors, it demonstrated the attraction the Academies have in the County.

Many thanks to all club coaches for their support of their players who were selected into the Birmingham Academies this year.

Both U15 and U13 programmes included strength and conditioning, player technical development and tactical awareness, in line with the England Netball program. Guest coaches were invited to deliver a number of sessions, which proved very popular with the players.

We attended 2 tournaments run by other Counties, as well as 'match play' days at Rugby School with a small number of other Counties. The 2 tournaments were very good experience for the players, the match play, on reflection, perhaps not so much. We also had

one friendly match against Severn Stars Academy hub. One issue at the tournaments and Rugby School match play were the lack of County coaches to manage the team. This resulted in players parents managing teams. Whilst the parents were qualified coaches, the use of non-County coaches was not ideal and did not portray a professional image. (For 2023-24 the County has more coaches in the team and therefore this situation should not occur).

Special thanks go to the coaching team of 2022/202, Anne-Marie Hooper, Jill Hogan and Dionne Williams, whom with myself and a team of guest coaches completed the necessary number of hours required by England Netball.

Also, a big thank you go to the Birmingham umpires that attended trials and tournaments.

For the upcoming season we have implemented a number of initiatives

- New Academy badge
- New Academy kit
- Addition of an U13 Development Academy
- Recruitment of new coaches into the Academy

The new group of coaches are looking forward to a successful 2023-24 season!

Birmingham Coach development group established in January 2023

Aims

- Create a group to support the development of coaches within Birmingham and thus improve the netball experience for players

Sutton Town were placed first with Little Sutton in second place for the regional stages. Aces qualified third and were chosen to play for the regional stages at Walsall.

Under 16's The semi-finals in the U16 category were between Sutton Town v Birmingham City and Parkside v Foxes . The final was played between Sutton Town v Parkside. Sutton Town were placed first with Parkside in second place for the regional finals. Foxes qualified third and were put forward for draw in regional stages.

The play offs for 3rd and 4th place and finals were played on the show courts. Parents and spectators were asked to make a small contribution to watch matches and this proved to be highly successful.

Umpiring Opportunities were offered to Into and newly qualified C umpires to umpire these matches so they could experience regional conditions. All umpires were highly praised by team coaches and managers and many at Into level have now achieved their C award. Carla

Total number of clubs has increased by 8 to 60 clubs this season.




Membership sat at 2513 people this year across all leagues.


